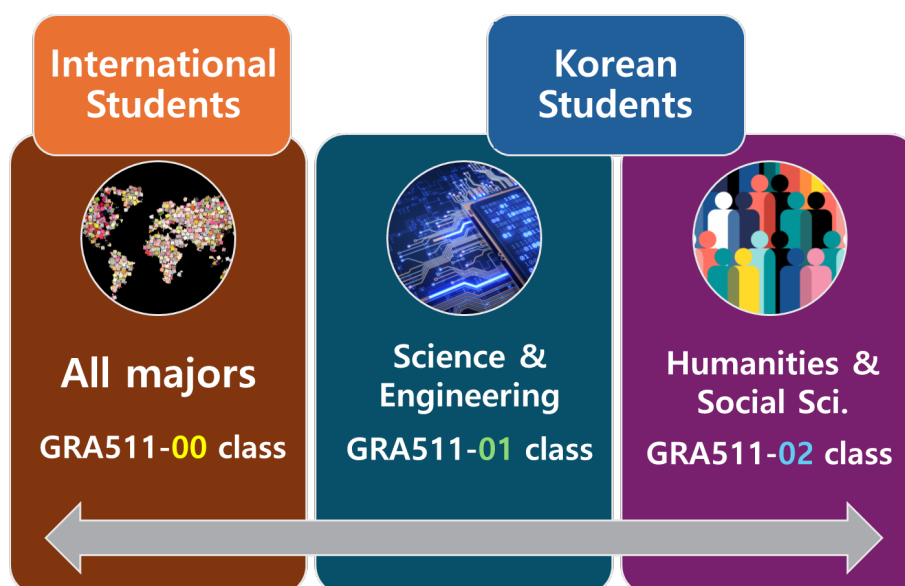

▷ Course Overview	- A mandatory core curriculum for improving graduate academic management and research competencies. - Fulfills graduation requirement (Research Ethics) or semester-specific mandatory training (Education for Disability Awareness) - Target audience: All new graduate students (1st semester master, 1st semester doctoral, 1st semester integrated master's-PhD). 2nd or 3rd semester-registered students can also take it once.
▷ Learning Goals	- Diagnose core competencies necessary for healthy and successful graduate research. - Develop foundational literacy in research methodologies, diversity and gender equality, human rights, mental health, research ethics, plagiarism, information technology, and research security. - Understand graduate school systems, graduation requirements, and regulations to develop a successful academic plan.
▷ Course Operation & Assessment	Mode: 100% online. Weekly lectures are uploaded on Saturdays. - Students must complete viewing of the videos at 1x speed and submit any required surveys or quizzes by Friday at 11:59 PM of the following week to be counted as present. - Attendance extensions for short-term illness etc. are not permitted, since the attendance window is at least 2 weeks. - About 18-20 hours of video lectures (each video 17-70 minutes, average ~35 minutes) are provided. - Each completed video grants "1 attendance point" (1P), regardless of the time length. Attendance requirement: ≥20 videos watched (including the 3 mandatory videos in Weeks 1-2). Attendance requirement is based on 14 weeks × 50 minutes = 700 minutes. Thus at least 20P should be obtained. Important! All major announcements and updates are posted in the course LMS. Check every week! Important 2! Update on Mandatory "Human Rights and Gender Equality" Education: Please be advised that the mandatory "Human Rights and Gender Equality" education program—which was previously provided automatically—has changed. Students are now required to individually apply for and complete the course through LMS.
▷ Grading	PASS requirements: ① Complete the 3 mandatory videos in Weeks 1-2.

(P or F)	② Complete the “Core Competency Assessment” before midterm (on KUchive platform). ③ Earn ≥20 attendance points (20P) by watching 20 videos (including the 3 mandatory ones). → All these 3 conditions must be met for PASS. → Failure to meet even one requirement results in F. → Retaking the course is possible, but an F may cause serious issues (e.g., ineligibility for graduate scholarships), so please confirm your own requirements carefully! For those who register the last semester, please pay extra attention for these requirements.
